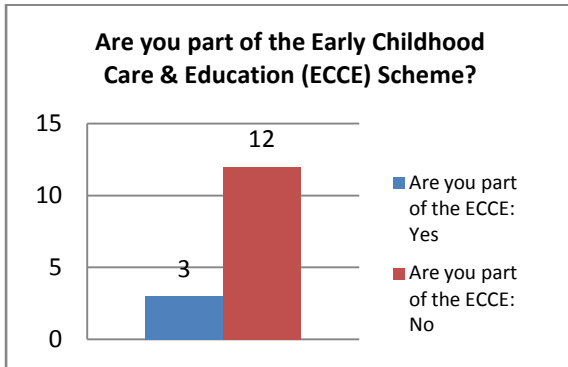

Findings

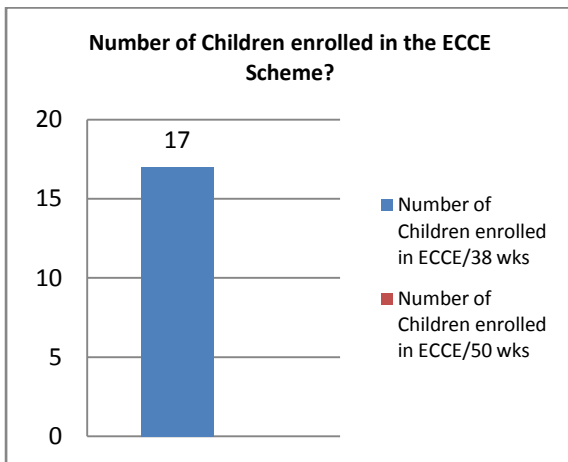
The findings of this report are based on 18 completed and returned 2010 Childminding Childcare Census forms.

Section 1.

Graph 1 indicates that three Childminding Services took part in the Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) scheme since September 2010. 12 did not.

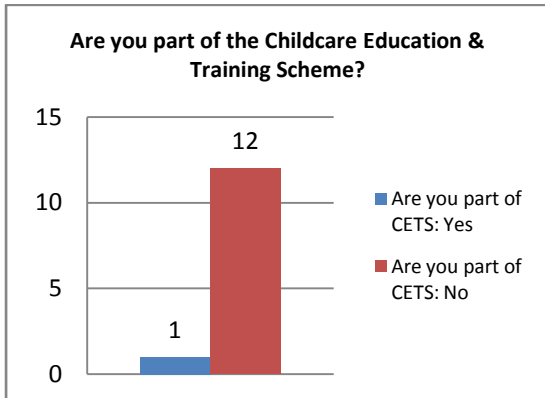


Graph 2 highlights that a total of 17 children have participated in the 38 week ECCE scheme since September 2010.



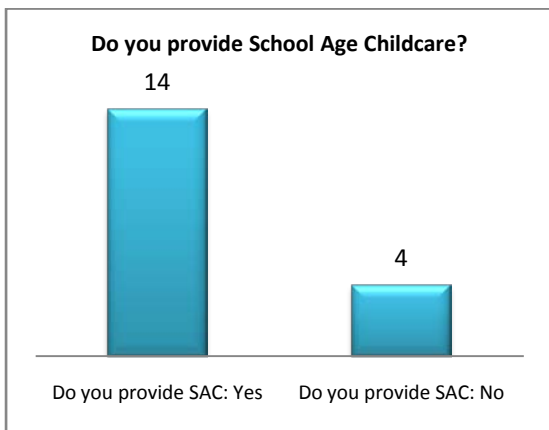

Only one childminder took part in Childcare Education & Training Scheme in 2010. 12 services did not take part.

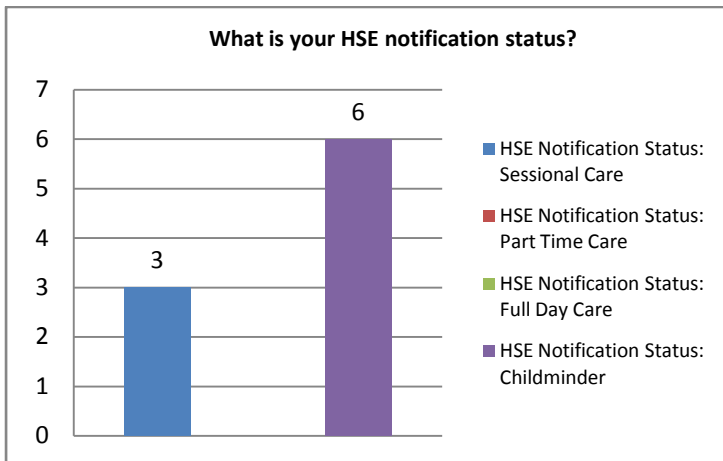


Section 2

Graph 4 indicates that 14 childminders provided a School Age Childcare Service (SAC) in 2010. Four childminders did not take part in SAC.

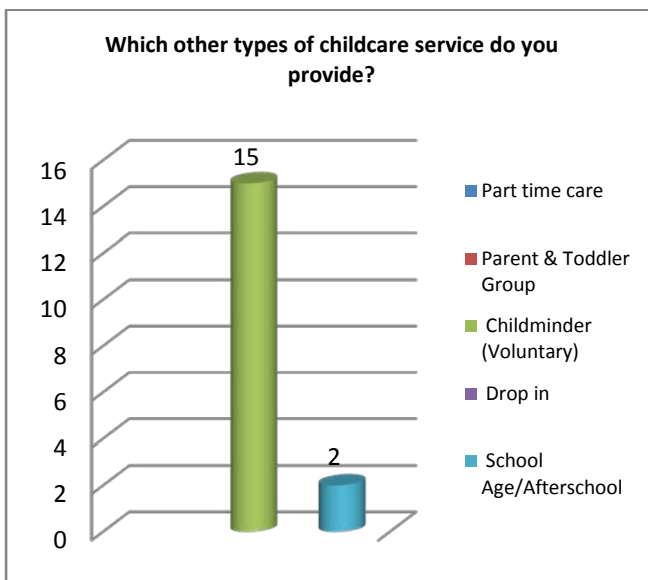

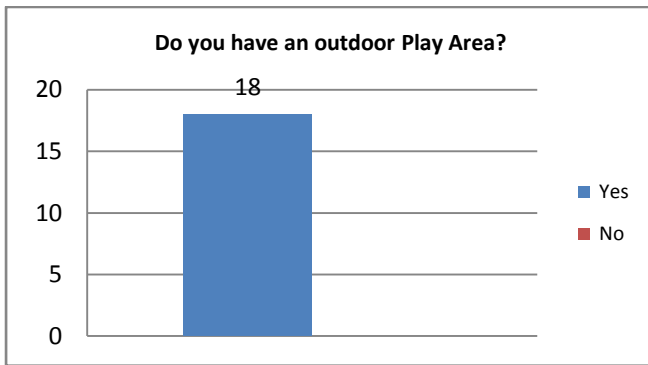


Six Childminders indicated that their HSE notification status is that of Childminder. However it must be noted that three childminders also offer Sessional Care.

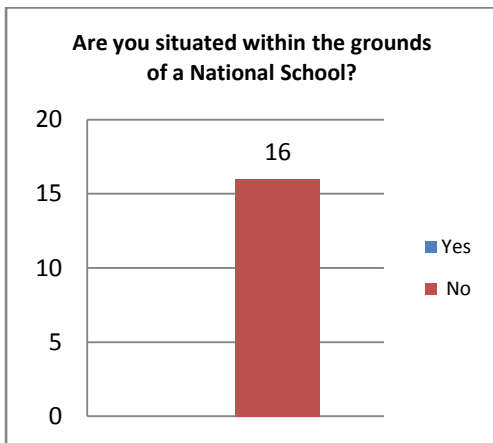

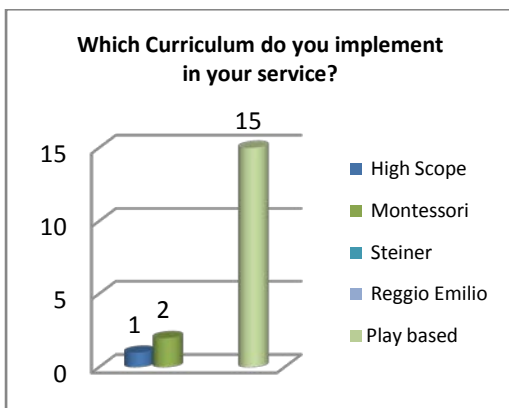
Graph 7 indicates that out of 18 census forms received all 18 Childminders provide an outdoor play area.

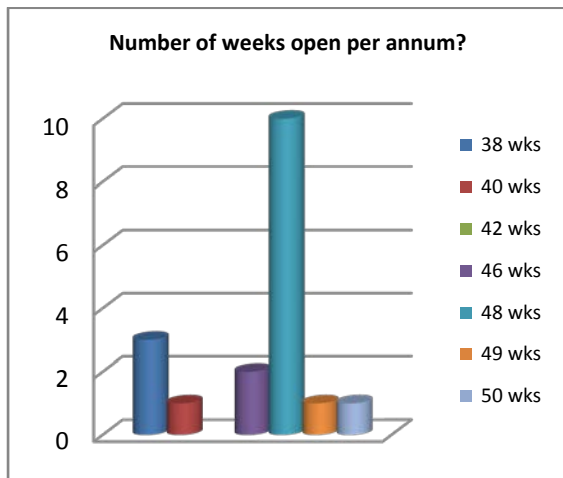


Graph 9 indicates that 15 of the childminders provide play based curriculum however it must be also noted that other curriculums are offered in conjunction with play based curriculum or on their own.



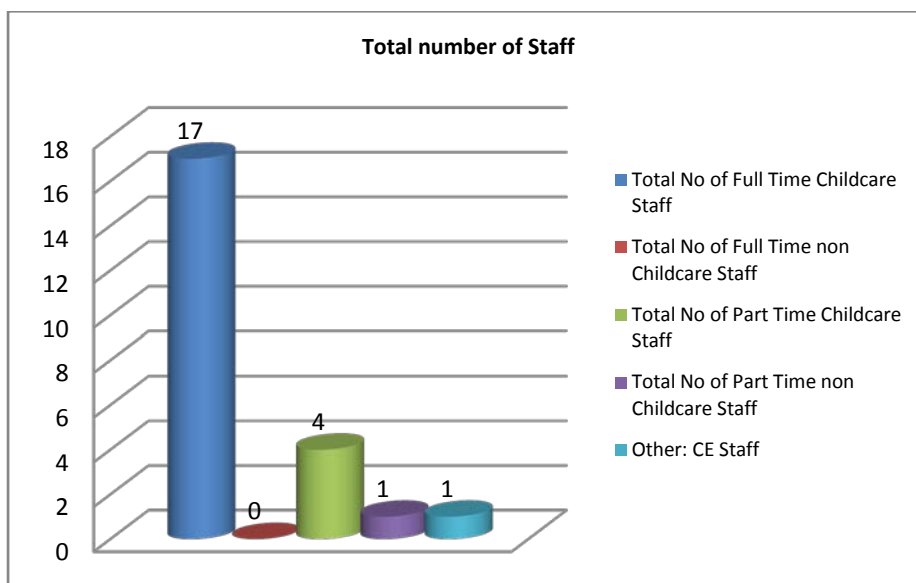

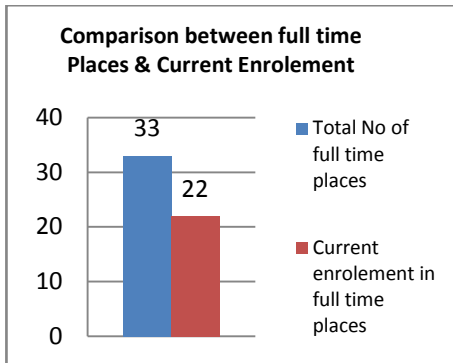

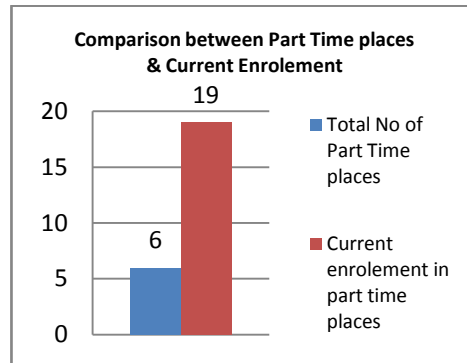

Graph's 12, 13, 14 & 15 show the comparison between HSE places and the actual enrolment within 18 of the Childminding Childcare services during 2010.

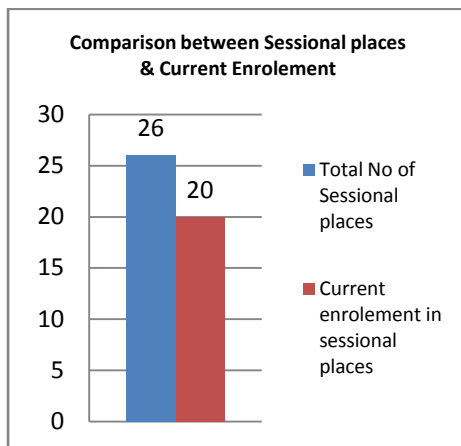

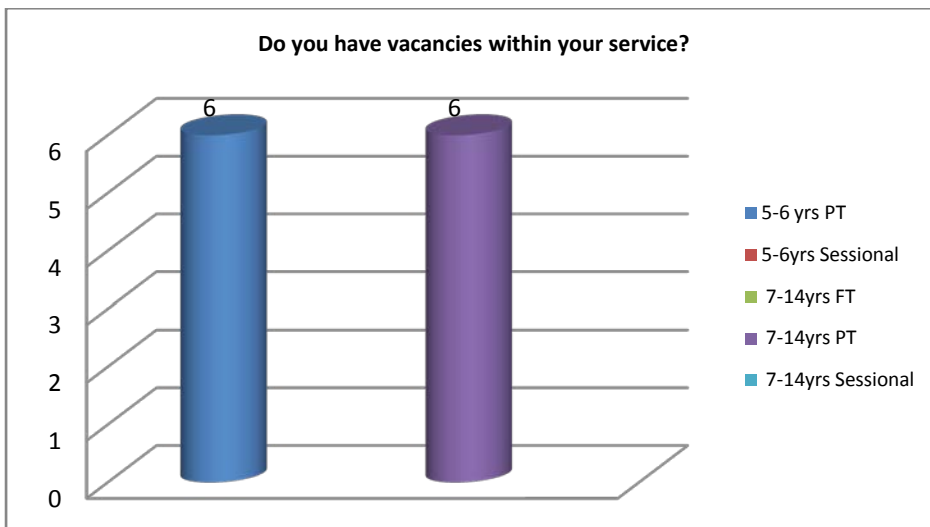


The amount of vacancies during 2010 within the 18 Childminders that participated in the census are shown in Graph 16 & 17 below.

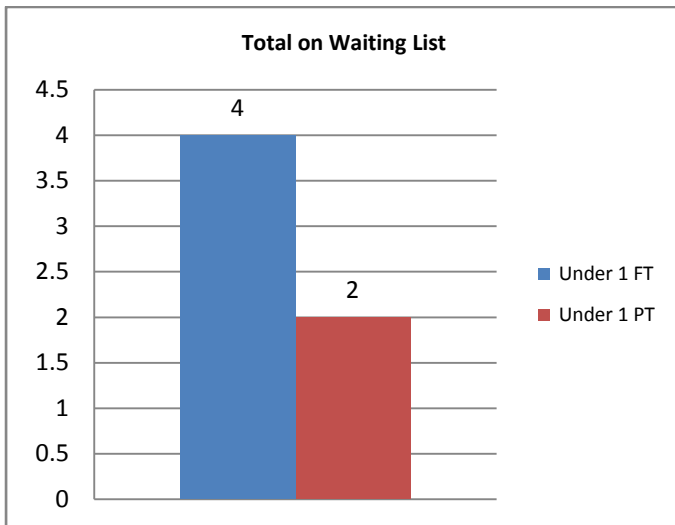

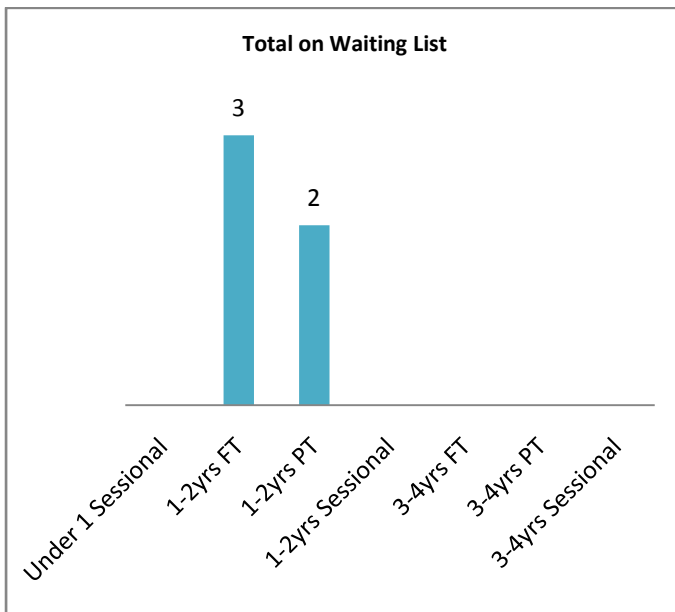

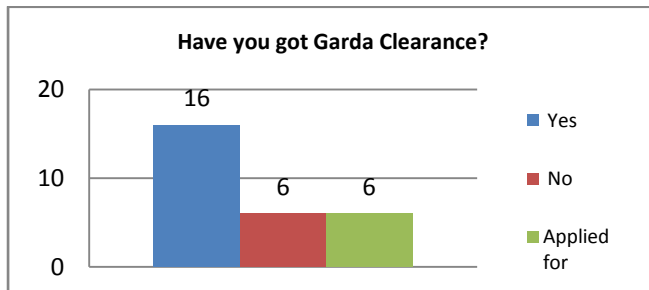
Section 6 & Section 7

Graph 20 below shows that 16 childminders have got Garda Clearance, six staff have not got Garda Clearance however they have applied for their Garda Clearance.

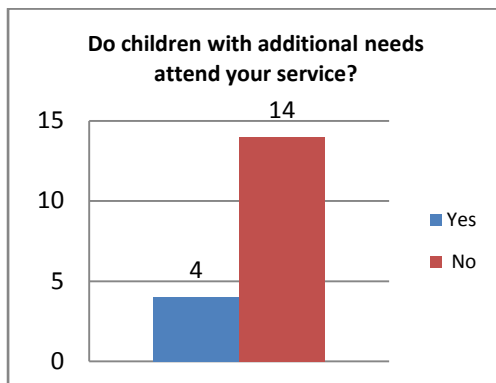

A total of two children from Ethnic Minority Groups attended a childminder in Co Roscommon at the time the Census was conducted.

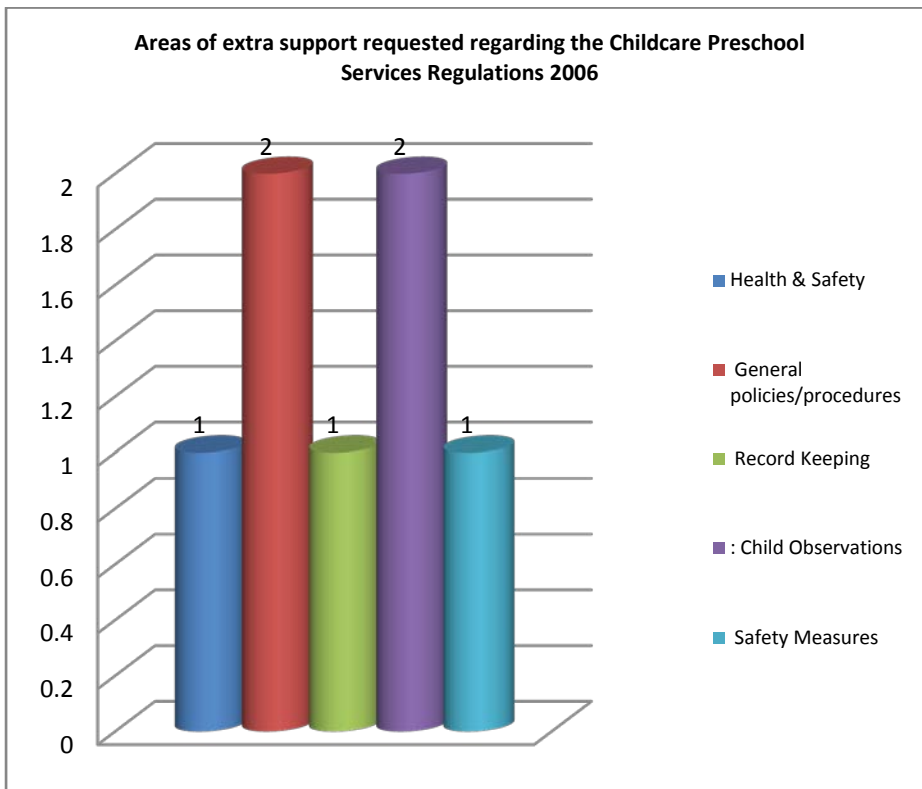

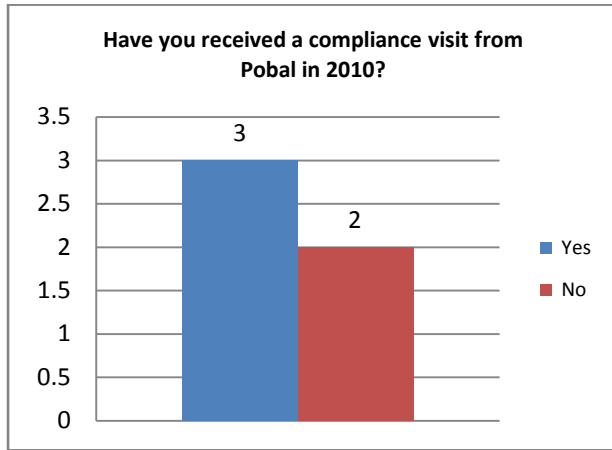
RCCC staff will support these three services to become fully compliant on an ongoing basis.

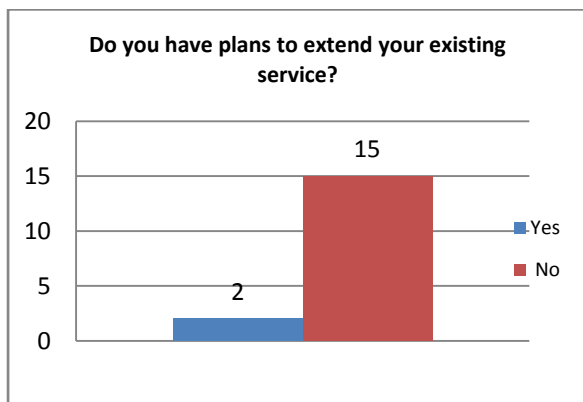

Graph 27 indicates that the three services in the ECCE scheme have received compliance visits

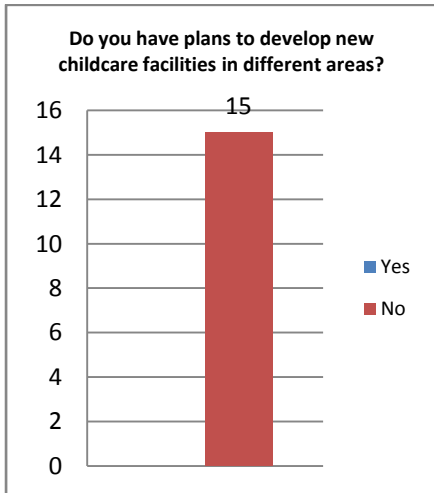
