What is the aim of the Childminding Little Libraries? The Childminding Little Libraries Initiative - supports childminders to develop little libraries in their homes with quality book titles in English and Irish. The focus of this initiative is to support early language and literacy development.

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<u>New Public Health Advice: All providers of Early Learning and Childcare, School Age</u> <u>Childcare and Childminding</u>

Updated COVID-19 Guidance to Early Learning and Childcare from 28 February 2022. Government have agreed to remove remaining restrictions relating to mask-wearing and physical distancing in early learning and childcare settings. If childminders or children wish to wear face masks or coverings, they may do so.



Consultation with childminders has informed the development of the Action Plan. Childminders will continue to be central to this process and will be consulted further at key stages.

National Action Plan for Childminding (2021-2028) – Steering Group was established in Sept 2021, to drive, oversee and monitor implementation of the NAPC.

This Steering group will support four Advisory Groups. Two Advisory Groups have been established and have representation from childminders and the National Voluntary Organisations.
